



## Land grabbing in Angola – A growing threat

Angola is a country rich in natural resources, such as diamonds and oil. When the oil price dropped, the government decreed a diversification of the economy, encouraging investment in agriculture from foreign as well as local companies. In 2004, a new land law was passed to protect small-scale farmers and rural communities. But often the legal procedure is not respected and farmers lose the land on which their livelihood depends.

The ten-minute video shows how LWF is working with rural communities, village chiefs, local and national administration to raise awareness and to support people in claiming their legal rights.

After the screening, Ophélie Schnoebelen, Rights-Based Approach Program Support Officer, and Cornelia Kästner, Senior Communications Officer will share information and answer questions about the filming and the work LWF does on land rights.
